Virginia Repertory Theatre Presents *Pipeline* by Dominique Morisseau

Richmond, VA – Virginia Repertory Theatre presents *Pipeline*, a modern and progressive piece of theatre that brings a timely and urgent examination of race and education to the stage. A riveting story unfolds about love, parenting and a mother's struggle to give her son a future out of the school-to-prison pipeline.

Dominique Morisseau's *Pipeline* is so compelling that it was one of America's most-produced plays in 2019.

"Pipeline is at once an homage to such authors as Lorraine Hansberry, Langston Hughes and Amiri Baraka and yet firmly the product of a unique, deeply resonant sensibility." – *Deadline*

According to the National Education Association, "The school-to-prison pipeline disproportionately places students of color, including those who identify as LGBTQ, have disabilities, and/or are English Language Learners, into the criminal justice system for minor school infractions and disciplinary matters, subjecting them to harsher punishments than their white peers for the same behaviors."

Morisseau is well acquainted with the school system from the inside, as she was an inner-city public school teacher who taught for 16 years in Detroit, where she grew up, and in all five boroughs of New York City. She has set the play in "any inner city environment where the public school system is under duress."

"The school-to-prison pipeline has national ramifications for students, teachers, parents, and families. I hope the story of Nya, Omari, and their struggles within a biased system inspire new audiences to push this important topic forward in their own communities," Morisseau said.

Virginia Repertory Theatre is taking her lead and inviting a number of local organizations working with teens to join this community conversation, and build understanding of perspectives on race and education. Virginia Rep is glad to share the list below of local organizations which use arts, education, and mentoring to empower children and teens to succeed. Representatives from these organizations have been invited to attend the play. We hope they can take the experience of this live exploration back to the community, so even more can join the conversation to build an understanding of perspectives on race and education in RVA.
