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



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

As Artistic Director of Education, Todd oversees our outstanding Education team's camps, workshops, and classes, and the Family Season in the Jessie Bogese Theatre.

Paul Dandridge, he/him, (Choreographer) is a collaborative choreographer who enjoys the process of discovering meaning and purpose behind movement. As an educator, Paul wants everyone he works with to feel comfortable and confident in movement and to realize that dance is fundamentally human – technical skill can augment, but all people are dancers. At Richmond Ballet, Paul was an Associate Director of the Minds In Motion program, writing scripts and creating dances for hundreds of 4th grade performers. At Henrico High School, Paul's work has doubled the number of dance teachers in Henrico County (to 2!) and expanded classes into Middle School. As a freelance choreographer, Paul has set work for many children's productions at Henrico High School (Newsies, Beauty and the Beast, Sister Act) and Cadence Theatre (Grease, High School Musical, Elf, Carrie). Leilani Fenick (Music Director) is a professional pianist and vocal coach in the Richmond area. In addition, he received a 2018 Helen Hayes Award for his direction of Lela & Co. and a 2020 Helen Hayes Award nomination for his direction of Agnes of God, both for Factory 449. Other directing credits include Dizzy Miss Lizzie's Roadside Revue's The Brontes (New York Musical Theatre Festival), Reykjavik (Rorschach Theatre), Emilie: La Marquise du Châtelet Defends Her Life Tonight (WSC Avant Bard), Driving Miss Daisy featuring Karen Grassle (Riverside Center for the Perfor- ming Arts), Junie B. Schuller boasts more than 20 years of experience managing the operations of complex, multi- venue and multi-disciplinary

organizations and has produced and presented live, touring and televised events that included collaborations with The Kennedy Center and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, among others.

Known as much for his collaborative nature as his creativity, he has worked on various projects with celebrities such as Martin Short, Eugene Levy, Tina Fey, Catherine O'Hara, Bob Martin, and Dave Thomas.

Most recently, Schuller served as the executive director and producer for Randolph Entertainment, which presented Teatro

ZinZanni and Cabaret ZaZou in partnership with Broadway in Chicago, from 2018-23. He led the planning, construction and launch of a unique new theater in a "forgotten" space that was rediscovered during a hotel renovation that revealed the original grand space inside the historic 1926 building in the Chicago Loop.

Schuller also served as executive director and producer for The Second City Canada from 2005-17, where he supervised the planning and construction of its Mercer Street home in Toronto and planned or led the construction of venues in Toronto, Cleveland and Las Vegas.
