



Carol Piersol

Virginia Repertory Theatre honors our good friend and colleague, Carol Androski Piersol, who passed away on May 9, 2023.

A titan of the Richmond theatre community, Carol was the founding artistic director of both the Firehouse Theatre Project and. later, the 5th Wall Theatre. During her combined tenure these two companies were the recipients of 35 Richmond Theater Critics Circle Awards, many of which she received right here on our stage. She consistently produced cutting-edge



American theatre over the course of her three-decade career, and as a result, helped transform the landscape of theatre in Richmond.

Carol was born in Brooklyn, NY, and grew up in Tyrone, PA, as one of seven siblings. As a young woman, she joined a theatre company that traveled around the United States and Europe performing on army bases, before moving to New York City to study theatre at the Neighborhood Playhouse under Sanford Meisner. There she met and fell in love with her husband Morrie (in an acting class!), and the two of them spent many years involved in the New York theatre world and sailing throughout the northeast coast. In 1985 they moved to Richmond along with their one-year-old son, where they continued to grow their family and develop a large, tight-knit network of close friends within and beyond their Fan neighborhood.

Carol will be remembered for her kindness and compassion, which she gave boundlessly, seeking nothing in return. In her theatre work, she celebrated the limitless power of the imagination and had a gift for recognizing and fostering the creative potential in others.

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
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LEADERSHIP



RICK HAMMERLY Artistic Director of Programming

Rick has worked as an award-winning, DC-based actor, director, filmmaker, and arts manager for

over three decades. He received a 2018 Helen Haves Award for his direction of Lela & Co. and a 2020 Helen Hayes Award nomination for his direction of Agnes of God, both for Factory 449. Most recently, he directed Virginia Repertory Theatre's Beautiful: the Carole King Musical and After December. Other directing credits include Dizzy Miss Lizzie's Roadside Revue's The Brontes (New York Musical Theatre Festival), Revkiavik (Rorschach Theatre). Emilie: La Marquise du Châtelet Defends Her Life Tonight (WSC Avant Bard), Driving Miss Daisy featuring Karen Grassle (Riverside Center for the Performing Arts). Junie B. Jones Is Not a Crook (Adventure Theatre MTC), Dead Man Walking (American University) and Closet Land (Factory 449).

TODD D. NORRIS Artistic Director of Education

Todd is an American theatre director, educator, writer, and actor. He recently served as president of the

International Museum Theatre Alliance and continues to act as an advisor.

Todd comes to Virginia Rep from the Children's Museum of Indianapolis, IN — the world's largest children's museum — where he worked since 2013, serving as Director of Interpretation and then Associate Vice President of Interpretation and Family Programs. In these roles, he was responsible for fiscal management, artistic direction for its professional children's theatre seasons, coordinating holistic approaches to gallery performances, and overseeing quality for hundreds of daily programs.

From 2003-2013, Todd worked at the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, eventually becoming Senior Manager of Performance Interpretation. While at Colonial Williamsburg, he also acted in several episodes of their Emmy-Award winning

of Hedwig and the Angry Inch, as well as nominations for his work in Angels in America (Signature Theatre), Me and Jezebel (MetroStage) and Oliver! (Adventure Theatre MTC). For ten years, he played Mr. Fezziwig in Ford's Theatre's annual production of A Christmas Carol and was most recently seen as Miss Tracy Mills in Round House Theatre's The Legend of Georgia McBride.

His debut film, *signage*, which he wrote, directed, and produced, has screened in over 60 film festivals worldwide, receiving 6 film festival awards and was subsequently licensed by MTV's LOGO Channel.

He is a founder and the current Producing Artistic Director of Factory 449, the recipient of multiple Helen Hayes Awards, including the John Aniello Award for Outstanding Emerging Theatre Company, and the Executive Director of the Washington Area Performing Arts Video Archive (WAPAVA).

Rick is a member of the Stage Directors and Choreographers Society (SDC) and Actors' Equity Association (AEA). He received a B.A. in Theatre from the University of Virginia, an M.A. in Film & Video Production from American University, and has completed the coursework for an M.A. in Arts Management, also from AU.

Favorite previous directing assignments include Humble Boy, Tales of Olympus, Eleemosynary, and The Santa Clues

He has taught and directed at several schools including The College of William and Mary, Christopher Newport University, Alice Lloyd College, and Wright State University.

He was born in Columbus, OH, and received his M.F.A. in Acting from University of Louisville and his B.A. in Theatre Performance, with a minor in music, from the University of Findlay. He is a member of the Stage Directors and Choreographers Society.

Todd will focus on programs for children, families, and schools including touring programs and arts in education. He and Desirée Roots will co-lead Virginia Rep's award-winning Community Health + Wellness program, which creates, implements and assesses model projects that demonstrate how theatre can be used as an effective tool in addressing critical educational and societal challenges.

Desirée has showcased her triple threat talent for over 35 years as an active member of the Gospel,

Jazz, and Theatre scenes regionally, nationally, internationally, and in Richmond, VA where she grew up. She started singing in church when she was four, and started her professional theatrical career at age 13. Growing up in a musical family, it was only natural that she follow in her performing parents' footsteps.

Desirée has performed throughout the East Coast with orchestras, jazz ensembles, and as leader of her own ensembles. She's been the opening act for internationally renowned artists including Boney James, Brian McKnight, the late Phyllis Hyman, and B. B. King. She is a Grammy nominated recording artist and has produced shows she wrote including *Ella at 100* in honor of the First Lady of Jazz, Ms. Ella Fitzgerald's 100th birthday. She received the Theresa Pollak award for "Vocal Excellence" in 2014.

Along with performing, Desirée has had a long standing career in the corporate and nonprofit sectors. Upon receiving her B.A. from Virginia Union University, she initially embarked on a teaching path. This quickly evolved into other opportunities such as a Programming Manager for Richmond Jazz Society, Inc., Booking Manager for Downtown Presents (now Venture Richmond), and client liaison for Drake Beam & Morin, a Fortune 500 corporation. She has also been an educator and music facilitator privately and within the Henrico and Richmond Public school systems for over 20 years.

Desirée began her association with Virginia Rep as a high school intern when the company was Theatre IV with the unique mission "to seek national-caliber excellence equally in four areas: the arts, education, children's health, and community leadership."

These four pillars of service are what drew her to become *Artistic Director of Community* — "working with the theatre company I love to serve the community I love."

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
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
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
