## Cadence Season

Bet ween Riverside and Crazy (October 13 - November 4, 2018), the 2015 Pulitzer Prize winning play by Stephen Adly Guirg's starts the season. When ex-cop "Pops" Washington welcomes his ex-con son back into his rent-controlled apart ment on Riverside Drive, he also welcomes some new, unlikely but frequent guests. Fighting to keep one of the last rent-stabilized apart ments in New York City, as well as fighting a discrimination suit against the New York Police Department, does not make his situation any easier. The play uses dark humor to examine the contradictions of justice and the human condition to persevere.
