The Silver Belles

Richmond, VA – Virginia Repertory Theatre introduces a new work to the Richmond community with *The Silver Belles*, running November 24 through December 31 at the November Theatre downtown in the Arts District. It's "Golden Girls" meets "Designing Women" with a heaping helping of well-known Christmas tunes and clever, new country and western ditties.

When Oralene, the longtime director of a small town Christmas Pageant suddenly passes away, the Silver Belles must come to the rescue. With the spirit of Oralene looking on, the sterling-hued vixens band together, discover their talents, and pull out all the stops to keep the beloved pageant alive. This play with music contains adult language.

Local actor/director Susan Sanford, who directs *The Silver Belles*, describes the show this way:

"I think one of my favorite things about the show is that it has so much heart in it. And I feel like, especially in Richmond, that people are really going to be able to recognize themselves and recognize traditions... whether it's for the holidays or helping people who are grieving. I think it's a really sweet show that everyone will be able to enjoy, especially at the holiday season."

The Silver Belles' book is by Allyson Currin, with music by Matt Conner and lyrics by Stephen Gregory Smith. These theatre professionals have worked together near Richmond, in the Washington, D.C. area, for some time. Conner and Smith also wrote *On Air*, the play we will present in the spring at Hanover Tavern. *The Silver Belles* is based on an idea by Cathy Alter and Sandra Johnson.
